

I graduated in the height of the pandemic when recent graduates were being called to the front lines. I was thrown in the deep end, which in hindsight was an opportunity of a lifetime. The breadth of knowledge and skills that I covered in that year, it would have taken me several years to learn otherwise.

Working in an emergency ward and treating patients with severe symptoms of Covid-19 was intense, but it was also illuminating. It helped me to realise that while I enjoy caring for patients, I also wanted to understand management, because that's where I felt I can make the most difference.

Across the world there aren't really healthcare systems but rather disease systems, which are far more concerned with treatment options than they are with preventative measures. 

I've always been interested in human rights but the Covid-19 pandemic refocused my career, and not in the way that most people would think. While the pandemic united everyone on a single issue, it also took attention away from unrest and injustice around the world.

The MA International Politics and Human Rights course at City deals with the intersection of human rights and politics well. When choosing a postgraduate course, this balance was key because political theories and interests are often the gateways to humanitarian efforts. Still, it's the human rights component of the course that I resonated with the most, particularly the opportunities to debate hot button topics such as migration and race with both peers and academic staff, whom I found to be truly open to different perspectives and who have in turn enriched my own. Coming from a finance background, City gave me the tools to cross paths into the humanitarian field. In fact, the Minorities and Indigenous Peoples in International Law module has helped me to secure an internship as the Head of Project Management at Incomindios UK, a charity that supports Indigenous people in North and South America by helping advocate for their rights.

For me, serving humanity is more than just a passion, I see it as a responsibility. Thanks to City, I'm now able to realise this.

City is the only university in the UK that offers MSc Temporary Works and Construction Method Engineering. When I first started the course, I travelled to London from Warrington in North West England but when the course moved online (well before the Covid-19 pandemic), things became inevitably easier. I was able to learn from the comfort of my home and use the facilities as and when I needed.

What I enjoyed the most about the course was the practical element, particularly the modules that included a site visit. I undertook a two-day residential course in Durham where I learned about groundwater pumping analysis, and a placement with Mace construction in London where I observed the implementation of several types of temporary works including tower cranes and how they are fixed to structures.



A home away from home



City's research pedigree spans more than a century and continues to change lives across the globe. In the most recent Research Excellence Framework (REF) 2021, 86 per cent of City's research was rated as 4* (world-leading) or 3* (internationally excellent) – a 10 per cent increase from REF 2014.

“My work demonstrates empirically the folly of placing non-core-business-experts into leadership and management roles. It shows that the current trend needs to be reversed – and urgently.”



How Brexit affects vulnerable women

“I particularly wanted to look at women who have been disadvantaged by Brexit. Vulnerable women seemed to be forgotten about, so my research has tried to bring these vulnerable women to the fore and to consider how Brexit specifically has affected them in the context of the EU Settlement Scheme.”



Understanding human displacement

Professor Christopher McDowell

“As a result of working with the UN and being able to have high-level meetings with the Home Office, I was able to get my point of view across and so the research contributed to a change of policy by the UK government to grant Syrian refugees permanent refugee status.”



Using non-invasive optical sensors to monitor brain injury

Professor Panicos Kyriacou

“The sensor is placed on the forehead and we shine light into the brain through the skull. The light bounces around, but some light is reflected back. We harness the light coming back – at different wavelengths – and then we apply machine learning models to tell us how that light is affected by hemodynamic changes and intracranial pressure in the brain.”



Why we need thriving cultural and creative industries

Professor Andy Pratt

“If you want to survive in a political world, you need numbers. My work helped produce some of the very first measures on how large and important the cultural economy is for the UK, Europe and internationally. In this country, we have seen that the cultural economy is now worth more than what politicians thought. In fact, for the past 20 years it has been growing faster than the rest of the economy.”



Repairing a broken food system

Professor Corinna Hawkes

“What we’re interested in here at the Centre of Food Policy is how the food system really works – everything from farm to fork and beyond. In order to understand it, you have to engage with it, as well as with those in the system. That is what we do: talking to people who experience the problems of the food system – citizens – as well as policymakers and people who work in food businesses. By doing that, we can more effectively intervene and produce the evidence that shapes public policy and decision making.”



POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH DEGREES

Research is a vital part of City. In the most recent Research Excellence Framework (2021), 86 per cent of City's submitted research was considered world-leading (4*) or internationally excellent (3*) and City is now ranked 39 out of 129 universities in the UK for its research power*. Each research student is offered the opportunity to work closely with an academic in a stimulating environment that is designed to support their learning and development.

School of Communication & Creativity

The School of Communication & Creativity is a vibrant, innovative and cutting-edge research environment, home to several internationally recognised departments and interdisciplinary research centres. In the recent Research Excellence Framework (REF2021), 89 per cent of the School's submitted research was rated as 3* (internationally excellent) and 4* (world-leading).

The School has internationally acclaimed experts who are held in esteem by, and work with, UNCTAD, UNESCO, WIPO, the Department of Culture, Media and Sport, the British Council and the EU.

Our Department of Performing Arts research strengths include ethnomusicology; the interface between music and technology; various relationships between music scholarship and performance; and music analysis. While its reach is international, City's central London base attracts sizeable audiences for its extensive series of concerts, conferences and symposia.

The research strengths of the Department of Journalism include gender and diversity issues in journalism; international journalism including humanitarian news and coverage of conflicts; journalism policy, practice and ethics including digital media ethics; and new and emerging journalism including innovative journalistic forms, models and production methods. The Department enjoys considerable strength in partnerships through its close connections with diverse industry bodies and through its collaborations across and outside of City.

The Department of Media, Culture and Creative Industries is committed to extending English Studies to non-canonical, global and interdisciplinary areas through its research, public-engagement and impact activities and by promoting research-led, non-traditional curricula. It has research-led academic provision, which deliberately decolonises and re-envision the curriculum.

The School offers supervision for research degrees across its core disciplines:

- **Culture and creative industries** (creative economy, arts and cultural management, and creative cities)
- **English** (literature, creative writing, publishing and popular culture, global, transnational, noncanonical and marginalised Anglophone literatures)
- **Journalism** (business and leadership, digital practice, ethics, history, law and regulation, representation and democratisation, new and emerging journalism)
- **Library information science** (foundations of the information sciences, questions of documents and documentation, information behaviour)
- **Media and communications** (international communications and news institutions in the global age; gender, media and development; transnational media and globalisation)
- **Music** (ethnomusicology, musicology, composition and technology).

School of Policy & Global Affairs

The School of Policy & Global Affairs has a vibrant multidisciplinary environment. In the recent Research Excellence Framework (REF2021) 86 per cent of the School's submitted research was rated as 3* (internationally excellent) and 4* (world-leading).

The School's academics provide advice and guidance to the UK Home Office, the UN, the OECD and briefings to UK ministers, the Ministry of Defence, the Foreign and Commonwealth Office, the Department for International Development and the European Parliament among others.

Students have the opportunity to join active research networks and clusters such as the School of Advanced Studies, the Institute for Historical Research, European Social Survey, the Centre for Competition and Regulatory Policy, the City Political Economy Research Centre and the Centre for City Criminology.

The Department of Sociology and Criminology is ranked first in London for the proportion of world-leading research (REF2021). Its key areas of expertise are criminology, gender and sexualities, media research, work and society, and violence and society. The Department is home to the European Social Survey headquarters, which is a unique research centre that has an international reputation for coordinating Europe's most important cross-national survey.

The Department of International Politics is ranked eighth in the UK for the proportion of world-leading and internationally-excellent outputs. Its areas of strength are in the fields of International Political Economy, Foreign Policy Studies and International Social Justice. Its new specialisms are in Comparative and Modern History.

The Department of Economics is a leading centre for economic research in the UK with 85 per cent of its research and 92 per cent of its research outputs rated as world-leading (4*) and internationally excellent (3*) in REF2021. The research is carried out in three main clusters: economic theory, applied microeconomics, and micro-finance.

The School offers supervision for research degrees across its core disciplines:

- **Economics** (finance, health, monetary, fiscal and macroprudential policy and regulation)
- **International politics** (international political economy, foreign policy and diplomacy, international social justice, comparative politics, modern history and quantitative political economy)
- **Sociology and criminology** (media and communications, employment, crime and victimology, gender, youth studies and violence and society).

Bayes Business School (formerly Cass)

Bayes Business School is renowned for its impactful, world-class research that is as relevant to business and industry as it is to academia.

Academic staff apply their international perspective and industry experience to develop progressive thinking and explore imaginative new research angles on subjects ranging from marketing to investment, leadership to innovation. Each student is allocated two or more dedicated supervisors who will guide their research and foster their development as academic researchers.

Together, they form a vibrant and well-integrated intellectual community with common collaborations and exchanges across different fields. This community regularly gathers in seminar series, where well-developed and less-developed work is presented and discussed in a constructive and friendly atmosphere. Two PhD courses are offered: the full-time PhD and the part-time Executive PhD.

The full-time PhD offers specialisations in the fields of finance, accounting, actuarial science, management, marketing and operational management. Throughout the course, students benefit from comprehensive research training including intensive courses in the core topics of their discipline, advanced courses and development workshops and training designed to prepare them for the academic workplace.

The Executive PhD is designed to be flexible and enable busy executives to undertake a PhD without having to take a career break. It is for senior executives working in industry, government or not-for-profit sectors who want a qualification that combines academic rigour and practical relevance.

Executive PhD PhD

Duration

Part-time: four years

The course focuses on research that makes an impact on professional practice and broader business and societal issues.

It combines expertise in a range of business topics: management, finance, accounting and actuarial science.

Candidates explore a wide range of subjects, including the latest scientific insights, theoretical frameworks and professional applications, all set in an international context.

The course comprises ten 40-hour residential weeks with additional private study. It includes a thesis presentation in year four.

Career opportunities

The course supports the career development of high-profile, research orientated business professionals who use research to enhance their understanding of the organisations and processes they manage.

It is aimed at individuals who are at critical points in their careers and supports them to change direction or secure more senior positions.

PhD MPhil/PhD

Duration

Full-time: four years

The course is designed for students who want to conduct their research in a world-class business school and an intellectually stimulating environment.

In year one, students attend a PhD-level education programme assessed by coursework, examinations and a thesis.

On completion of the first year of education and successful pass of their transfer panel at the end of the second year, students are registered for a PhD.

During years three and four, students deepen their research, finish research articles and present them at workshops and conferences. Every student is expected to submit a thesis and attend a *viva voce* (oral examination).

Career opportunities

A common route into academic research is a postdoctoral research post or fellowship after completing the doctorate. While some PhD recipients go on to permanent academic positions, others pursue a career in industry research.

School of Health & Psychological Sciences

The School of Health & Psychological Sciences is committed to enhancing health and wellbeing by partnering with healthcare users and practitioners, and delivering research that is innovative, usable and policy-relevant.

The School is looking for researchers to join a dynamic and stimulating research environment and build on the vibrant research culture in eight areas: maternal and child health, applied vision, health services research, language and communication science, mental health, healthcare innovation, psychology and food policy.

The School's research centres offer a very supportive and well-resourced environment for individuals wishing to pursue a postgraduate research degree (both MPhil and PhD). Students benefit from individualised supervision, participate in regular seminars, and can take up a suite of development activities based on their training needs. These might include patient and public involvement and engagement, research methods, methods of analysis and interpretation, and dissemination strategies. They may also choose to gain experience in teaching.

Academic staff and students benefit from recent multi-million-pound investment in new facilities including bespoke laboratories, public-facing clinics, simulation suites and a dedicated area for research students. Additionally, the School is uniquely placed to offer PhD students access to University of London research facilities, including its own extensive clinical networks.

Examples of PhD graduates' research include: public health nutrition advocacy in the UK; patients' quality of life with glaucoma; risk perception regarding pregnancy and childbirth; patient's reconstructive memories of critical care and nurses' understanding and response to these; addressing health inequalities in disadvantaged groups using health psychology theory and evidence; neurodevelopment and risk factors in schizophrenia; and mental representations and processes in intertemporal choice.

Research degrees MPhil/PhD

Duration

Full-time: three years

Part-time: six years

There are three routes to an MPhil/PhD degree within the School:

- **Major Thesis:** students undertake a significant piece of original research and write a thesis based on that research.
- **Thesis incorporating Prospective Publications:** students undertake a significant piece of original research and prepare articles for publication in peer-reviewed academic journals as they proceed through their period of study. In the thesis, the published articles may be embedded within chapters which also contain the critical analysis, or they may be interspersed among chapters written in traditional thesis style.
- **Prior Publication:** students who have published a significant body of articles in peer-reviewed academic journals spend between one and two years writing an extended treatise which draws this research together with analysis of previously published work by others into the context of a single overarching thesis.

Research degrees MPhil/PhD

Duration

Full-time: minimum period of registration is two years; maximum is four years


Part-time: minimum period of registration is three years; maximum is seven years

PhD students are assigned two supervisors to support them throughout their research. They also benefit from the School's Research Training Programme which focuses on research skills and methodologies, employability skills, career management and personal development.

PhD students become part of a stimulating research environment by participating in the activities of the School's research centres, institutes and groups.

The award of a PhD requires the submission of a thesis for examination at a *viva voce* (oral examination) by two examiners, at least one of whom is external to City. A PhD thesis (up to 100,000 words) must be an original and substantial piece of work which makes a contribution to the relevant literature. All students are initially registered for an MPhil degree. Those students who wish to proceed to a PhD must upgrade within 18 months (30 months for part-time students).

The School offers the following types of research degrees: PhD by Major Thesis; PhD by Prospective Publication; PhD by Prior Publication and MPhil.

The School is home to the following research centres, comprising teams of academic staff with international reputations in their fields: Software Reliability; gi (data visualisation); Human-Computer Interaction Design; Artificial Intelligence; Mathematics; Biomedical Engineering; Sensors and Instrumentation; Photonics and Instrumentation; Sustainable and Resilient Civil Engineering; Systems, Aeronautics and Aerospace; Autonomy and Control; Thermo-Fluids; and London Space Innovation.

All doctoral students are initially registered as MPhil students, except when they have transferred from another institution and have provided suitable and appropriate evidence that permits direct registration as a PhD student.

A research degree provides a superb opportunity for able students to dig deep into a specialist area to advance knowledge for the benefit of many. It is a remarkably satisfying and rewarding venture.

Duration

Full-time: one year

Part-time: two years

Full-time: one year

Part-time: two years

The course examines the creative industries and their interface with the wider economy at a global scale. Moreover, cultural assets are carriers of meaning and their global circulation impacts those who consume them, affecting identities and reproducing social and economic inequalities.

Duration

Full-time: one year

Part-time: two years

Based in the heart of commercial and literary London, City has a distinguished track record in helping students to publication. This course helps students hone their skills in creative writing and learn how to develop their work for the modern publishing environment. Alongside core and elective modules, students take the Creative Writing Workshop and Special Studies modules in which they share their work with their peers and analyse contemporary literary fiction, genre fiction or creative non-fiction texts. Students work with experienced lecturers and published authors across these genres and complete their qualification with a 15,000-word piece of creative writing.

Full-time: two years

Part-time: four years

Full-time: ten months

Investigative Journalism MA

Duration

Full-time: ten months

A pioneering course that is intense, challenging and designed to equip students with the reporting and research skills needed to produce investigations that matter. Basic reporting leads quickly to advanced methods, including working with data, Open Source Information building sources and using public records and access to information laws.

Case studies of high-profile investigations help students understand how to investigate companies, organisations and individuals for issues of public concern, miscarriages of justice or abuse of power, ethically and legally. Students will work individually and in small groups to produce high-quality text, audio and film. Students will complete several complex and ambitious investigative projects under the guidance of experienced professionals.

Career opportunities

Graduates move into employment across print, online and broadcast media. Economic Evaluation in Healthcare MSc

Part-time: two years

The demand for specialists in health economics continues to increase as more advanced and expensive healthcare puts pressure on policy decision-makers and industry managers. Health economists' responsibilities range from identifying new interventions in healthcare that compete with existing ones to appropriate economic modelling to aid decision-making for funding.

The course is designed to train students to meet the current demand for health economists in the field of health technology assessment. It introduces students to the conceptual bases for economic evaluation, quantitative methods and modelling skills relevant to healthcare decision-making.

It includes modules in economic evaluation, health economics, quantitative methods, economic evaluation workshops (modelling), welfare economics and epidemiology. Students are also required to write a dissertation.

The course explores issues and problems in the study of foreign policy through an engagement with the theoretical and real-world dimensions of foreign policy analysis, a salient strand of International Relations Theory. It focuses on traditions and techniques in the areas of strategy, diplomacy and decision-making in the context of foreign policy and economic diplomacy.

The course deals with a range of topics relating to the economic, political and professional dimensions of diplomacy and foreign policy with reference to key regions. It provides students with a research-led education in this dynamic field.

Postgraduate students work with academic staff who are clinical practitioners and are engaged in interdisciplinary research across the fields of nursing, midwifery, food policy, health management and policy, optometry, public health, radiography, psychology and language and communication sciences. The work of the School is focused on transforming the provision of healthcare services in the UK and internationally.

The School offers a variety of master's courses providing an opportunity for graduates and healthcare practitioners to develop their skills and advance their careers. It also offers research degrees enabling graduates to have a direct impact on healthcare policy, services and practice.

It is committed to ensuring students graduate with the skills, confidence and experience to succeed and progress in their chosen careers, whether in clinical practice, leadership, research or education. Courses are taught by expert staff and clinicians from world-leading health institutions. Post-registration courses are professionally relevant and work-focused, which enables students to develop as competent practitioners and leaders in their profession.

Scholarships for both home and international students are available for master's courses, including the Dean's Scholarship for Academic Excellence and the School's International Excellence Scholarship.

Alongside City's student services, the School of Health & Psychological Sciences provides further guidance both for students' professional development and wellbeing. The most recent Research Excellence Framework (2021) ranked the School 18th in the UK and 2nd in London for the overall quality of its research and rated 100 per cent of its research environment and 100 per cent of its research impact as either world-leading (4*)

or internationally excellent (3*) within Allied Health Professions, Dentistry, Nursing and Pharmacy Unit of Assessment.

Research is often multidisciplinary and involves partnerships with service users, NHS Trusts, local authorities, government bodies and non-governmental and third-sector organisations. Examples of the School's research include midwifery investigations into reforms in maternity and women's health, and strategies to improve maternal mental health. In nursing, research examines service user involvement in mental healthcare, ways to improve detection and response to deteriorating patients in acute care, and care for those with long-term conditions such as dementia. In health services research, academic staff are engaged in studies looking at complex interventions, clinical communication, and technology-enabled healthcare. Research within optometry and visual science includes the early detection of glaucoma and age-related macular degeneration, occupational vision assessment and ophthalmic public health and more fundamental studies in visual psychophysics, neurobiology and visual optics. Within language and communication sciences, research explores therapy for people with aphasia, innovative collaborative work in education with adolescents with communication difficulties, and developing language and communication skills among deaf and hearing-impaired children. Research within the food policy area brings together exploration of how the food system works in practice and what policies are needed to make it more effective. Research within psychology investigates the effectiveness of psychological interventions to improve wellness as well as a range of questions related to memory.

Many of the courses offer international opportunities and collaborations, bringing together students and staff from over 60 countries with a global community of alumni and partners. There are opportunities for students to undertake research collaborations with institutions abroad, clinical placements overseas, student exchanges with leading institutions and other activities as part of the School's growing international network.

This holistic approach makes the course unique. Students can select the Prescribing or Non-Prescribing route. Adult and Mental Health Nursing (Pre-registration) MSc

Duration

Full-time: three years

This is an innovative course designed to prepare students to lead, manage and support evidence-based care for people of all ages and with both physical and mental health needs.

This is a combined course, where on successful completion students are eligible to register with the Nursing and Midwifery Council as a registered nurse in the mental health and adult field of nursing. Students graduate with the skills and knowledge needed to equip them to support the delivery of quality healthcare in a contemporary health service.

Mental illness has a huge impact on the physical health of an individual. People with mental health conditions are at a higher risk of experiencing physical health problems, such as diabetes and heart disease. In addition, people with long-term physical health conditions are more likely to suffer from mental health issues, particularly depression.

Career opportunities

The course ideally positions students to pursue accelerated career pathways and become future leaders, clinical experts or researchers within the nursing profession, across both adult and mental health fields of practice. Students are given opportunities to prepare for interviews and develop Personal Development Plans during the course.

Delivered as a blended course

Duration

Part-time: Up to 40 weeks

Duration

Full-time: two years
Part-time: three years

Clinical Optometry MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year taught course plus up to one year for the dissertation

Part-time: two years taught course plus up to one year for the dissertation

Preparing optometrists to provide enhanced clinical care to patients, the course emphasises the co-management of patients and the expansion of the optometrist's role in ocular therapeutics.

Psychology

Behavioural Economics MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year

Part-time: two years

Behavioural Economics applies psychological insights to human behaviour to investigate how people make economic decisions under various conditions of constraint (e.g., time and knowledge) and influence (e.g., social pressure). This is an important field in modern economics and the social sciences more generally.

Commercial organisations have long known the limitations of individual decision-making and they routinely use this knowledge in their commercial practices (e.g., the anchoring effect of minimum payment on credit cards). The real-world implications of behavioural economics are varied and significant and acknowledged to provide a powerful and cost-effective approach to improving human welfare.

The course is taught by psychologists and economists offering students a good foundation in both disciplines.

Career opportunities

Behavioural economists use data to better understand human behaviour. These highly valuable skills can be applied in a range of professions, for example to formulate policies or to analyse consumer behaviour. There is increasing demand for behavioural economists across different sectors, including financial trading and risk assessment, consumer psychology and marketing, consulting and public policy. The research focus of the course also allows graduates to proceed to PhD level research in economics or psychology.

Full-time: one year

Through the Centre for Psychological Wellbeing and Neuroscience the course has close links to community mental health services, which provide students with clinical internship opportunities to gain experience in applied clinical settings. Additionally, students can get hands-on research experience in neuroscience methodologies through research internships offered by our Cognitive Neuroscience Research Unit.

Counselling Psychology DPsych

Duration

Full-time: three years

A professional taught doctorate course approved by the Health and Care Professions Council and accredited by the British Psychological Society (BPS).

Graduate Entry (Hons) LLB

Duration

Full-time: two years

The senior status law course is a rigorous and competitive programme and allows non-law graduates to receive an LLB law degree in just two years.

Students have the opportunity to gain skills and knowledge in core legal subjects and specialist areas of law.

In year one, candidates study four of the seven core foundation subjects usually covered in an undergraduate law degree. In year two, students take the remaining three core subjects and have the opportunity to enhance their knowledge of particular areas of law by choosing six elective modules.

The course attracts international students from around the world, Canada in particular. Canadian law-specific electives can be chosen in year two.

Professional legal training

Bar Vocational Studies PGDip/PGDip with Specialism/LLM

The internationally renowned Bar Vocational Studies programme, for aspiring barristers, offers flexibility and choice in how students study the vocational stage of training for the Bar.

The course is designed to reflect the work of the Bar, with a focus on advocacy, drafting and written and oral advice. This is all underpinned by case analysis and legal research as well as knowledge of the rules of civil and criminal procedure, evidence and professional ethics.

The course offers the choice of three different routes depending on whether students simply wish to qualify as a barrister or whether they wish to further enhance their employability and develop specialist knowledge and skills.

The course is available as full-time or part-time study. Students who choose to study part-time will have classes on two days per week, over two years, allowing them to work alongside their studies.

Solicitors' Practice Programme PGDip/LLM

Duration

Full-time: nine months (PGDip),
one year (LLM)

The Solicitors' Practice Programme is designed for those preparing for the Solicitors Qualifying Examination (SQE), the new route to qualifying as a solicitor in England and Wales.

Over two 10-week terms, students will study material that will help prepare them to pass SQE1 and SQE2. Students may exit at this stage with a Postgraduate Diploma.

The Master of Laws (LLM) pathway provides an additional 5-week elective term and submission of a legal practice research project to deepen students' understanding of an area of legal practice that is of particular interest.

Students will build on their existing legal knowledge and will acquire the knowledge and skills required both for the SQE assessments and for practising as a Solicitor.

Career opportunities

The City Law School has a long tradition of training solicitors. Many of our graduates have taken up employment in prestigious firms. The programme has been designed with the benefit of advice from a range of solicitors' firms and is tailored to equip students with the knowledge and skills that firms seek, especially commercial acumen.



School of Science & Technology

The School's courses are informed by world-class research and practice, and are focused on transforming the lives of future generations. Completing a postgraduate course at the School of Science & Technology enhances students' career prospects and prepares them to tackle the big challenges of society: energy, the environment, healthcare, big data, artificial intelligence and modern infrastructure. The School offers postgraduate students opportunities for development within their chosen specialist field of study but also as socially responsible professionals. The School is committed to supporting future global leaders in STEM by awarding generous scholarships and opening doors to advanced professional qualifications to the best candidates from around the world. Recently, City entered into a strategic partnership with Engineers Without Borders UK, aimed at embedding responsibility into education and student experience and preparing the School's graduates to produce sustainable solutions in their future careers. Students can develop their leadership skills by taking part in the Global STEM Challenges Think Tank, an annual debate with experts from industry. They also benefit from diverse guest lectures, mentoring schemes and CitySpark, a support scheme for young entrepreneurs.

The School actively maintains close relationships with industry leaders, who employ City graduates to bring fresh ideas and creativity to their teams. In turn, these leaders help to ensure that courses at City reflect current practice and industry requirements. The School has a dedicated unit that supports students with work-based experience through internships and industry-based projects. Over the last 20 years, the Corporate Relations and Employability Unit has helped City students secure placements and/or employment across a range of organisations including Disney, Microsoft, Barclays, IBM, Accenture, the NHS, Arup, E.ON, EDF, Nissan, BMW, Airbus and Rolls-Royce. In addition, all courses are accredited by the relevant professional bodies i.e., the British Computer Society, the Royal Aeronautical Society and the Institute of Mechanical Engineers. Further to this, some programmes are certified by specialist institutions such as the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) signifying the School's high-quality education in cyber security.

The strength of the School's research base was recognised in the most recent Research Excellence Framework (2021) with over 90 per cent of Engineering and Computer Science research classified as either world-leading (4*) or internationally excellent (3*), demonstrating the vast impact City has on the wider society. Much of the research is conducted in

partnership with some of the leading companies in the world including Philips, GE Healthcare, Shell and BAE Systems and this industry insight is passed on first-hand to the School's postgraduate students.

High-quality academic spaces are crucial for nurturing creativity. The School recognises this and the key role a modern and vibrant physical environment plays in student development and learning experience.

The School benefits from attractive lecture theatres, learning and communal spaces as well as fully equipped, state-of-the-art engineering and computer laboratories.

Academic staff in the Department of Engineering work in diverse fields, sometimes in partnership with leading professionals such as design consultancies Arup, Skanska, WSP and Thornton Tomasetti. In the field of electrical and electronic engineering, the Department is renowned for its expertise in developing sensors and instrumentation, particularly in the field of biomedical engineering. There is a growing involvement in research in the field of autonomous systems as well as working on managing systems complexity in design and confronting the challenges of cyber security. The Engineering Department was the first in the UK to offer courses in Aeronautical Engineering. It has outstanding facilities for applied research and is particularly strong in the field of experimental and computational fluid dynamics, two-phase flow, turbomachinery and energy systems, waste heat recovery and compressor technology.

The Department of Computer Science works across three broad areas. In software and systems engineering, research examines fundamental theories, methods and technologies related to the development, assessment and verification of complex sociotechnical and software-intensive systems. In the field of human-computer interaction, academic staff focus on the accessibility and usability of interactive systems supporting human-computer activities and the development of novel interfaces and devices for such systems. Finally, research on data-intensive systems explores the development of novel methods and frameworks to support the modelling, search, analysis, consumption and evolution of massive text and rich media including images and sound. Courses in artificial intelligence, cyber security and data science reflect particular research expertise in these areas.

Safety and security are important aspects of the maritime industries. These include protection and regulation, incident investigation and management, piracy, cybersecurity, risk and uncertainty, resilience, human factors and leadership and management.

The course is directed towards professionals from the merchant marines, navies and those in land-based maritime occupations. Students should have a good grounding in their respective academic discipline or considerable work-based experience.

While focusing principally on maritime and offshore issues, there is an emphasis on the related fields of port security and the preservation of the marine environment. Students also benefit from prestigious visiting speakers from industry to talk on specialist topics. Additionally, the course takes advantage of the importance of London as an international maritime hub.

Career opportunities

The course is multidisciplinary and is designed to develop safety and security experts who are technically literate and understand risk and uncertainty analysis of maritime safety issues, design effective practices and contribute insights from applied research. It is focused towards management and leadership careers in marine safety management in the marine and offshore sectors and policy or regulatory organisations.

Mechanical engineering

Advanced Mechanical Engineering MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year

Part-time: two years

The course offers a blend of theory and practice to help students develop the skills and knowledge required for advanced mechanical engineers. The course is designed in collaboration with industry and professional bodies.

Topics covered include advanced fluid mechanics, structural mechanics, manufacturing technologies, gas turbine engineering, vehicle propulsion, advanced heat transfer and robotics.

Students gain an in-depth understanding of the fundamentals and acquire professional skills and appreciation of the latest engineering developments in the energy, manufacturing and transport sectors.

The research project provides an opportunity to apply knowledge and develop a deep understanding in a specialised topic of choice. The course is accredited by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE) on behalf of the Engineering Council as fully meeting the academic requirement for registration as a Chartered Engineer (CEng).

Career opportunities

Graduates have wide-ranging employment opportunities including at Ford, Rolls-Royce, Lotus, BP, Howden, Shell, Heliex Power, Bühler Sortex, Transport for London, Jaguar, Delphi and Holroyd.

Energy and Environmental Technology and Economics MSc

Duration

Full-time: one year

Part-time: two years

The drive towards increased efficiency and decarbonisation of power generation, transport, industry and domestic energy use will require professionals with the ability to see beyond traditional subject boundaries and understand the complex inter-relations between technological, economic, political and behavioural aspects of the energy sector.

The course aims to instil the knowledge and vision required to deliver a sustainable future. It maintains strong links with industry, which provides students with a range of perspectives on current issues relating to energy policy, low-carbon technologies, user behaviour, energy markets and regulation.

The course contains pathways that qualify as further learning for accreditation with the Energy Institute for Chartered Engineer and Energy Manager status.

Career opportunities

With strong industry links, expert lecturers and a diverse range of modules on offer, the course equips graduates to become leaders and entrepreneurs in energy management, supply or policy-making.

Studying made affordable

Postgraduate study at City is an affordable option for students from a wide range of backgrounds.

Although students will usually have to pay for postgraduate study themselves, many sources of funding exist including scholarships, studentships and loans. During their time at City, students can obtain financial advice and support from City's award-winning Student Centre.

Scholarships and loans

Postgraduate scholarships

City has a wide range of scholarship opportunities available for students in all six of its Schools.

Research Council studentships

Research Councils may be able to provide financial assistance for UK, EU and overseas postgraduate students. It is best to contact the council relevant to the specific area of study directly to enquire about eligibility and application.

Charities and trusts

There may be funding for postgraduate study available from charities and trusts. The British Council has a scholarship search database that many find helpful.

Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA)

Students can apply for Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) if they live in England and have a disability that affects their ability to study, such as a learning difficulty, a mental health condition, physical disability or a long-term health condition.

Hardship Fund

City's Hardship Fund provides discretionary financial assistance for students experiencing unexpected financial hardship to help them remain in higher education. The Fund is administered by the Student Centre and is intended to act as a safety net for those in financial difficulty.

Postgraduate loans

Postgraduate loans are available from the Government to help cover the cost of postgraduate study. Students undertaking a master's degree can apply for up to £11,836* to help pay tuition fees or living expenses. The loan is non-means tested and paid directly to the student.

If a student is interested in undertaking a research degree, they can apply for a Postgraduate Doctoral Loan for up to £27,892*, divided equally across each year of the course.

Tailored advice for international students

With a diverse student population drawn from over 160 countries, City's vibrant atmosphere makes it a special place to study.

Choosing to study abroad is one of the biggest decisions some students make, which is why City offers advice and support at every step of the journey.

A dedicated international team

The International Student Recruitment Team typically visits over 50 countries each year, meeting prospective students interested in studying at City. As the Covid-19 pandemic recedes, the number of in-person events will increase but online events will continue for those in territories where travel is restricted. Additionally, a worldwide network of agent representatives is on hand to help students with their applications.

Our specialist International Student Advice and Compliance team helps international students with immigration queries and concerns and supports them to settle in with a series of activities during Welcome Week, designed specifically for international students.

Visa requirements

Students are responsible for obtaining necessary visas and entry clearance into the UK and are advised to prepare in advance by researching the requirements for students from their home country. Information about applying for, and extending visas to study, is available on City's website. A team of dedicated International Student Advisers can help with the visa application process.

If students have an existing Student visa that was issued for study at another university, college or school in the UK, they will need to complete a new Student visa application with the UK Home Office using a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) from City before they will be allowed to register.

English language requirements and courses

As City's courses are delivered in English, students whose first language is not English will need to undertake a language test to demonstrate their English ability is sufficient to undertake degree-level study. English language requirements vary by course and are likely to be higher than the minimum English language requirements set by the Home Office for students requiring a visa. City's partner, INTO City, runs pre-sessional English courses during the summer to help students improve their English before their courses start.

Applying to City

Choosing a postgraduate course at City is the beginning of a journey towards a rewarding career.

How to apply

Applications for the majority of postgraduate courses need to be made directly to City. To apply, visit the webpage of the intended course of study and click on the 'How to apply' tab to read more about the application process, including any supporting documentation required and to access the online application system.

With a few exceptions, most postgraduate courses do not have a fixed application deadline and operate on a rolling admission basis. Applications will close when the course is full, so students are encouraged to apply as early as possible. Where a deadline is in place, further information can be found on the specific course webpage.

Entry requirements

Applicants for postgraduate study should normally hold a university honours degree in a relevant subject. However, if students do not hold an honours degree (or an equivalent qualification) but have suitable experience or professional qualifications, they may still be accepted for a master's course or a Postgraduate Diploma at the discretion of the relevant School.

Students who are in the final year of their undergraduate studies or are yet to receive their English Language test results can still apply for most postgraduate courses at City. Their applications will be assessed based on predicted grades and if all other entry criteria are met, applicants might receive a conditional offer subject to them satisfying the relevant conditional requirements.

Pre-master's courses provide a route to several of City's courses for students that do not qualify for direct entry. Students can take a City validated course with INTO City or study with City's partner, Kaplan International College London. Courses at both providers guarantee progression to City for students that meet the required grades.

Tuition fees and living costs

Tuition fees vary by course and further information can be found on the website. Remember that tuition fees do not include the cost of accommodation and students will need to budget for this along with flights, food, travel, books and personal items. Where necessary, City's temping agency, Unitemps, can help students find suitable work.



Reaching City from within London

The nearest Underground stations are Angel on the Northern line (Bank branch) and Barbican and Farringdon on the Metropolitan, Circle and Hammersmith & City lines. Farringdon also serves the Elizabeth Line (Crossrail).
